
SUMMER 2015 NEWSLETTER

Nearly the end of June already and visitor numbers are increasing. The Nab Tower lantern is progressing well. A damp-proof membrane has been added to the base and the newly painted uprights and sides

moved into position. Before being bolted down, a thick rubber seal has been laid underneath each one where it rests on the base plate. It is now beginning to look like the base of a lighthouse lantern. The next job is to install the mezzanine floor and some 'lighthouse shaped' steps up to it. We have the original



metal grille pieces but need a framework to raise the floor about 2' 6" off the ground. Luckily the Castle volunteers have many skills and we know a man who can make us the necessary frame. So, onwards and upwards we go.



We are looking forward to the visit of Sofie Livebrant, the Swedish pop singer, and her musicians when they come to Hurst to perform her music and also to find out about life in a lighthouse. The concert is in the afternoon of Wednesday 22nd July, starting at 2pm and free to everyone. The event is being filmed for a documentary to support

Sofie's scholarship, which has been sponsored by the Swedish Government.

The team at Hurst have been asked to provide a display for Durlston Castle near Swanage about lighthouses and the ALK's role in keeping their heritage alive. This runs from September 3rd to October 8th, which just happens to coincide with the AGM weekend in Weymouth at the end of September, during which a visit to Anvil Point lighthouse has been arranged.
